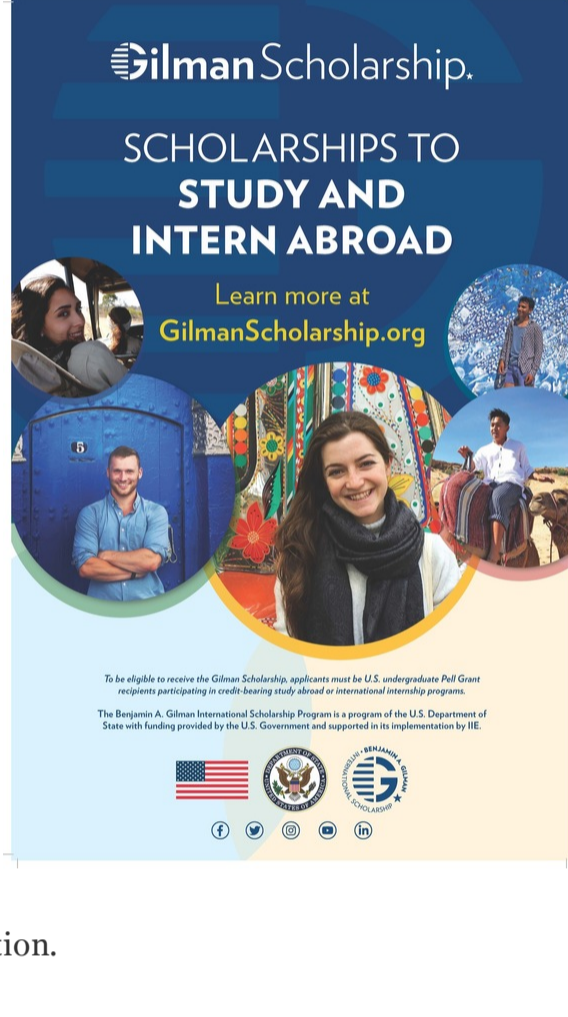

### Benjamin A. Gilman Scholarship

The U.S. Department of State's Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship Program offers students of limited financial means funding to study abroad. Gilman provides scholarships of up to \$5,000 to U.S. undergraduate students of high financial need participating in credit-bearing abroad programs or up to \$8,000 for students studying a [Critical Language](#). ### Senior Fellow for Internationalization

The new [Senior Fellows for Internationalization](#) program is an opportunity for seniors who live on campus to serve in leadership roles that focus on specific University priorities. Students who serve as Fellows will receive an annual \$3,000 stipend for 8 to 10 hours of work each week and have the opportunity to be mentored and developed as leaders across a variety of specific content areas. The program is open to all rising seniors living on campus for the duration of the 2020-2021 academic year.

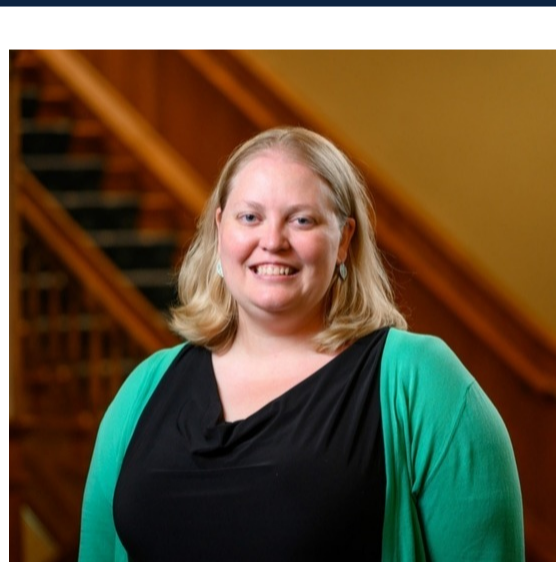
