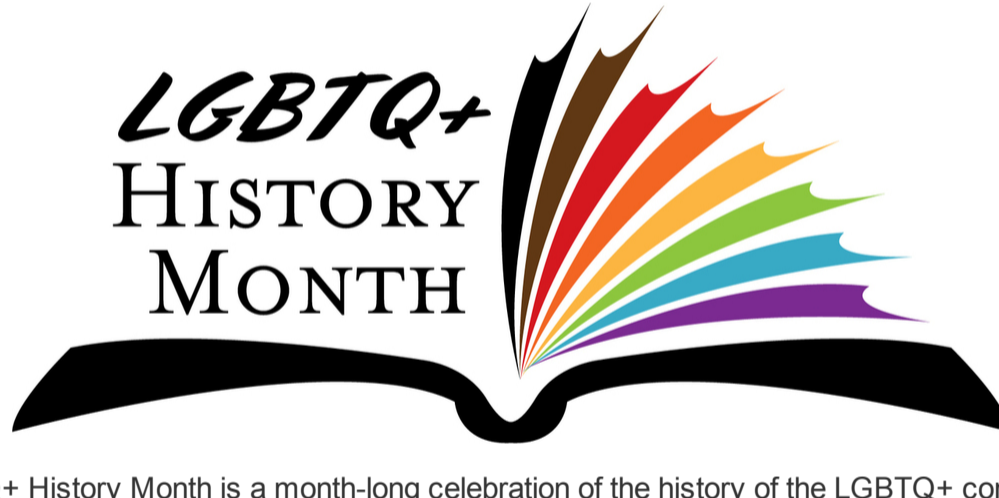

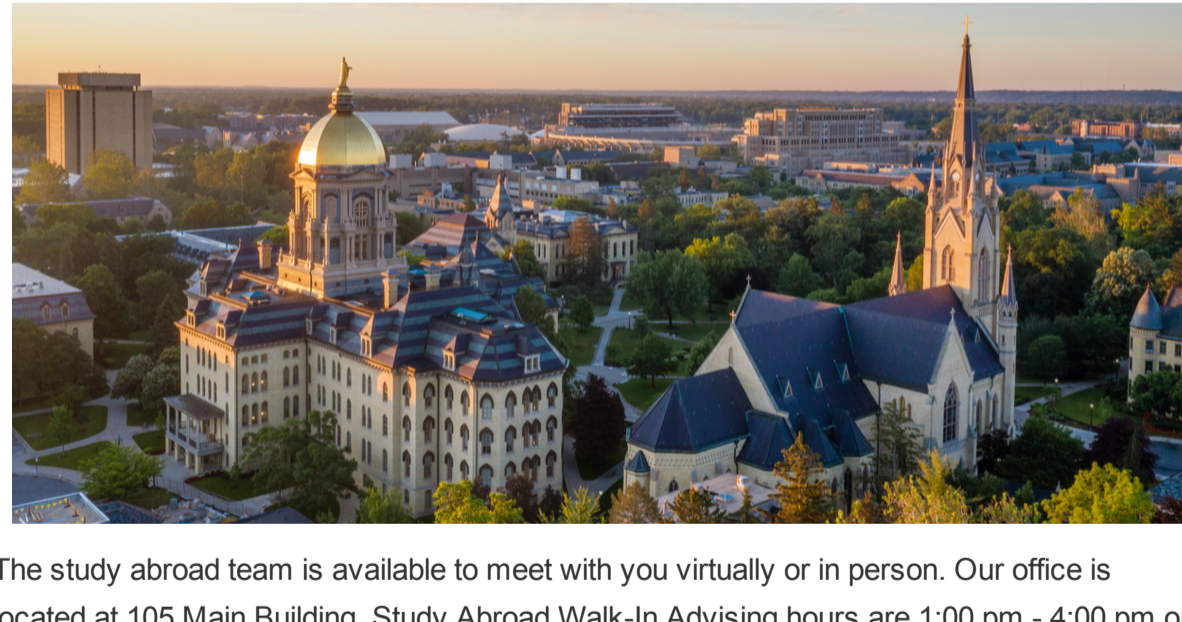
In study abroad, we are committed to the values of diversity and inclusion. We encourage you to visit the [resources on our website](#) to help you in the study abroad process.
