Gilman International Scholarship Program](#) enables students of limited financial means to study or intern abroad, providing them with skills critical to our national security and economic prosperity. [Gilman Scholarship](#) broadens the student population that studies and interns abroad by supporting undergraduates who might not otherwise participate due to financial constraints. The program aims to encourage students to study and intern in a diverse array of countries or world regions. The program also encourages students to study languages, especially critical need languages (those deemed important to national security).

The deadline to apply is October 6, 2022!

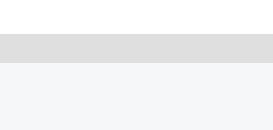
